PREFACE

Third International Conference on Water, Energy and Environment (ICWEE), 24–26 March 2015, Sharjah, United Arab Emirates

This is a special issue of the *Desalination and Water Treatment* Journal for the Third International Conference on Water, Energy, and Environment. The conference promoted a global collaboration among faculty, students, engineers, and managers on ecological economics and water, energy, and environment resources management.
